Contribution to Economic Diversity.** New businesses that diversify the types of retail and restaurants in the area provide a broader mix of offerings for consumers and drive market demand by creating a vibrant atmosphere, attracting foot traffic, providing diverse services, etc. Priority will be given to businesses that have a demonstrated market demand and align with the broader goals for revitalizing downtown. **Please circle a number to score.**

- 2. Community Impact.** Proposed applications should positively contribute to the community through designs that are visually appealing and cohesive to the surrounding area, creating public spaces (e.g., outdoor seating, open events, or other public facing components), or by actively engaging with the community during and after the improvement process (e.g., partnerships, events, community outreach). Priority will be given to businesses that can showcase a positive impact to the community. **Please circle a number to score.**
